

THE RESORT VILLAGE OF PELICAN POINTE

Bylaw 02-2017

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON PUBLIC RESERVE AND THE USE OF THE HIGHWAYS

The Council for the Resort Village of Pelican Pointe in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. Short Title
 - a) This bylaw may be cited as *The Parking Bylaw*
2. Interpretation
 - a) Clerk - means the clerk/administrator of the municipality
 - b) Highway - means a road, parkway, driveway, square or place designed and intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles, but does not include any area, whether privately or publicly owned, that is primarily intended to be used for the parking of vehicles and the necessary passageways on that area as ascribed by The Traffic Safety Act
 - c) Motor Vehicle - means a vehicle propelled or driven by any means other than by muscular power.
 - d) Municipality - means the Resort Village of Pelican Pointe
 - e) Parking - has the meaning ascribed thereto by The Traffic Safety Act
 - f) Public Reserve - as ascribed by The Planning and Development Act 2007
3. The Resort Village of Pelican Pointe shall determine where parking in the Public Reserve is allowed. Areas not allowed will be known either by signage or when parking inappropriately restricts the movement of other vehicles.
4. No person shall park a vehicle on any street so as to obstruct the entrance to a driveway or approach leading to private premises.
5. No person shall park a vehicle in any "No Parking" area as designated by signs erected and maintained by the Resort Village of Pelican Pointe
6. No person shall park a vehicle on any Public Reserve at one place for a period of time exceeding forty-eight (48) hours.
7. The Resort Village of Pelican Pointe may take whatever actions necessary to remedy a contravention to this bylaw including ticketing and/or towing of vehicles.
8. A designated officer who believes that a person has contravened this bylaw may serve Notice of Violation in the amount of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). Voluntary payment may be paid to the municipality within seven days thereby avoiding prosecution for the contravention.
9. Failure to pay the Notice of Violation may lead to prosecution and a fine as set out in The Non-Compliance Bylaw, 2005

THIS BYLAW shall come into force and take effect immediately after having received Third and Final reading.
