THE RESORT VILLAGE OF PELICAN POINTE

BYLAW NO 4/87

A BYLAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE.

The council of the Resort Village of Pelican Pointe, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1-1 This Bylaw may be cited as "The Traffic Bylaw".
- 1-2 In this Bylaw:
 - a) "Resort Village" means "Resort Village" as defined by the Urban Municipalty Act.
 - b) "Street" means that portion of every public road, street, driveway or public place in the village for use by vehicles.
- 2-1 The Police shall have authority to temporarily prevent parking on any street or portion thereof whenever in their judgement it may be necessary in order to avoid traffic congestion, danger, or an accident.
- 2-2 Not withstanding any other provisions of this Bylaw, the Council or Clerk shall have authority to temporarily prevent parking and/ or prohibit traffic on any street or portion thereof to allow any work to be carried out by or on behalf of the Village, such work to include snow removal, repairing or maintenance of such street.
- 3-1 The Council may authorize the Mayor or Clerk to erect or maintain on any street in the Village any warning or direction sign, marker signal or light for the direction of traffic.
- 3-2 No person shall deface, injure, knock down, remove, obscure, block off, or interfere with any driveways or roads or direction sign marker or light erected or maintained by the authority of Council.
- No person, unless authorized by the Council, shall erect or maintain on any street in the Village any warning sign, marker, signal, or light.
