Notice - we have a positive lab result showing Dutch Elm Disease is in our community.

Residents will please follow the below immediate steps concerning Elm trees on their property:

- Elm trees should not be pruned between April 1 and September as this is the 'active' season for the disease. The Pointe will not put any Elm branches through the chipper during this active period.
- Consult the below links to assist you in self diagnosis of a potential diseased tree. If you are fearful you have a diseased tree take in a sample to: Crop Protection Laboratory (CPL) in Regina for confirmation. The address is 346 McDonald Street Regina, SK S4N 6P6
- Upon a positive result please inform the RVPP Council so we can track the disease and be on the lookout
- The resident must immediately remove their private tree
- There are several tree removal services in Regina that you may contact one that I have contacted is Sawyer's Tree and Landscapes
- The resident will take their private tree to the landfill and it will be burned.
